IX ICAE World Assembly and IX ICAE General Assembly

June 2015



The World Assembly of the International Council of Adult Education took place from June 11 to 13, 2015 and was followed on Sunday, June 14, by the IX ICAE General Assembly. The main objective was to create a connection between the international movement for adult education and the concerns of social movements and organizations in Quebec and Canada.

The World Assembly was organized through several plenary sessions (Plenary Public Session: Women, Natives and the Decolonization of Education; Introduction to the Thematic Workshops; Patrick Bonin - Greenpeace Canada; Voices in Dialogue and Closing Plenary), as well as workshops and different activities (Popular Education City Tour, Stands, Opening Ceremony and Celebration Dinner).



On Thursday evening the **Opening Ceremony and welcoming cocktail** had the interventions of **Pierre Doray** - ICÈA President, **Michael Ahríhron Delisle jr**. - Grand Chief Mohawk Community of Kahnawake, **Alan Tuckett** – ICAE President, **Arne Carlsen** – UIL Director; **Guy Breton** – Rector of the Université de Montréal and the moderator was **Léa Cousineau** – ICÈA.

The activities went on with the Plenary Public Session: **Women**, **Natives and the Decolonization of Education**. Around the world, indigenous and racialized peoples are challenging what is knowledge and how education functions to maintain fundamental injustices and inequalities grounded in Western Countries. We, adult educators, activists and the women movements, are involved in redefining education in order to open the doors to ending racial hierarchy. This opening panel of the ICAE World Assembly united women involved in these struggles from different regions of the world to decolonize knowledge and education. The event was chaired by ICAE/GEO, a strong pillar of ICAE for years, together with the <u>World Women's March (WWM)</u> in Quebec.



The speakers were: **Viviane Michel** - President of Quebec Native Women and WWM; **Sandra Morán** – WWM Guatemala; **Helena Wong** – Global Justice and the group spearheading WWM USA; **Celita Eccher** – former ICAE Secretary General and member of the Board of Trustees of DAWN and GEO; **Aminata Diallo Boly** – Program coordinator of Education at Andal & Pinal Association for the training of nomadic pastoral

communities in Burkina Faso and member of GEO; Swarnlata Mahilkar – NIRANTAR India and member of GEO; Moderator: Shirley Walters – University of Western Cape Town and member of GEO.

The **Plenary:** Introduction to Thematic Workshop took place on Friday morning with a discussion about the Education Post-2015 agenda as it faces the challenges of climate change. This was followed by the Plenary "A conversation between Greenpeace and the ICAE" with **Patrick Bonin** (Greenpeace Canada) and **Roberto Guevara** (ASPBAE and ICAE Vice president for and South Pacific ASIA Region).



In the afternoon, dozens of workshops were coordinated by organizations from Canada and from abroad. They prompted the discussion and allowed the exchange about the concerns of these groups in the context of the Assembly's themes and the Education Post-2015 agenda.

In the afternoon, there were **Simultaneos Thematic Assemblies** (Right to education and lifelong learning for all, beyond 2015; Capacity building for advocacy; Role of adult learning and education for sustainable development; Adult Learning and Education, Power Relations, Decent Work, Gender Equality and Community Engagement and Quality inclusive education for all) and the **Closing Plenary**, whose main purpose was reporting from the thematic Assemblies, Final Declaration and Words of Thanks.
